What do Computer Network Support Specialists do?

Computer network support specialists analyze, test, troubleshoot, and evaluate existing network systems, such as local area network (LAN), wide area network (WAN), and Internet systems or a segment of a network system. They play an important role in the routine maintenance of their organization's networks such as performing file backups on the network. Maintenance can be performed daily, weekly, or monthly and is important to an organization's disaster recovery efforts. Solving an IT problem promptly is important because organizations depend on their network systems. Network support specialists may assist the organization's computer users through phone, email, or in-person visits.

Training & Educational Opportunities

You will have many opportunities for employment as a computer network support specialist, but first you will need to complete specific training and earn an associate degree. Your coursework will center around computer and information science. To keep up with changing technology, you will likely need to continue education and learning throughout your career.

As a Computer Network Support Specialist you will:

- Analyze and report computer network security breaches or attempted breaches
- Back up network data
- Configure security settings or access permissions for groups or individuals
- Document network support activities
- Identify the causes of networking problems, using diagnostic testing software and equipment
