What do Computer User Support Specialists do?

Computer user support specialists provide technical assistance to computer users who are having problems. They answer questions or resolve computer problems for clients in person, via telephone, or electronically. They may also provide assistance concerning the use of computer hardware and software, including printing, installation, word processing, electronic mail, and operating systems. Some computer user support specialists work for large software companies or for support service firms and must give instructions to business customers on how to use business-specific programs such as an electronic health records program used in hospitals or physicians' offices. Sometimes they work with other technicians to resolve problems.

Training & Educational Opportunities

You will have plenty of employment opportunities as a computer user support specialist, but first you will need to complete specific training and earn a certificate or associate degree. Your training will include coursework in computer science, engineering, and information science.

As a Computer User Support Specialist you will:

- Perform regular maintenance to ensure that networks operate correctly
- Test and evaluate existing network systems
- Troubleshoot local area networks (LANs), wide area networks (WANs), and internet systems
