What do Radiologic Technologists do?

Radiologic technologists are the healthcare professionals who perform diagnostic imaging procedures, such as X-ray examinations, magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) scans and computed tomography (CT) scans. Radiologic technologists are responsible for accurately positioning patients and ensuring that a quality diagnostic image is produced. They work closely with radiologists, the physicians who interpret medical images, to either diagnose or rule out disease or injury. Some radiologic technologists prepare a mixture for the patient to drink that allows soft tissue to be viewed on the images that the radiologist reviews.

Training & Educational Opportunities

An associate degree is the most common educational requirement for radiologic technologists. Education programs typically include both classroom study and clinical work. Coursework includes anatomy, pathology, patient care, radiation physics and protection and image evaluation. You will need to pass an exam to become a licensed radiologic technologist in the state of Illinois.

As a Radiologic Technologist you will:

- Adjust and maintain imaging equipment
- Position the patient and the equipment in order to get the correct image
- Precisely follow orders from physicians on what areas of the body to image
- Protect the patient by shielding exposed areas that do not need to be imaged

Radiologic Technologists are in demand in Livingston County!
